rom Stephen Schwartz (*Godspell* and *Pippin*) and John Caird of *Les Miserables* comes a joyous and inspirational musical about parents, children and faith... not to mention centuries of unresolved family business!

Freely based on the story of Genesis, *Children Of Eden* is a frank, heartfelt and often humorous examination of the age-old conflict between parents and children. Adam, Eve, Noah and the "Father" who created them deal with the headstrong, cataclysmic actions of their respective children. The show ultimately delivers a bittersweet, but inspiring message, that "the hardest part of love... is letting go."

The cast includes several HCP "veterans": Bonnie Raubenstine and Sarah Zimmermann each playing Mama Noah; Bob Henke as Noah; Brita Raubenstine as Eve; and Jim Watson as Father.

Some newer faces in the cast are: Mat Barninger as Adam, Zack Terrazas as Cain, Sasha Watson as Abel and Shem, Jeremy Slagle as Japeth, Kyle Meisner as Ham, Kelly McMaster as Aysha, Hannah Pollard as Aphra, Jenn Hilker as Yonah, and Lauren Swartz and Jenn Flohr as the snake.

Tammy Terrazas, Joann Luckenbaugh, Shelby

Cooke, Lauren King, Ashley Rummel, round out the cast.

Although the stories are biblical, the theme is more about family and fathers' trials with their



sons as well as the forgiveness families struggle to find. With the underlying theme being about family, the cast shares several family bonds: Bonnie Raubenstine and daughter Brita, Tammy Terrazas and son Zack, and Jim Watson and son Sasha.

The show is directed by Jim Watson with musical direction by Sally Chase. Dancers from the School of Music and Dance will be choreographed by studio owner Lauren Swartz.

Show dates are Nov. 11–13 and 18–20 at 8 p.m. and a matinee on Sunday Nov. 14 at 2 p.m.
