A live theatre performance can be very exciting. All the people involved, both cast and crew, work very hard to be sure they give a great performance. It is the job of the audience to HELP the performers give their best performance possible. The audience can do this by practicing these simple rules of theatre etiquette.

- ◆ Arrive at the theatre on time.
- ◆ Turn off your cell phone or, if it must be on, put it on vibrate.
- ◆ Don't speak during the performance...whispering is still speaking.
- ◆ Remain in your seat for the entire performance. If you must leave, wait for an appropriate break in the show.
- ◆ Do not eat or drink in the theatre. If you must have a cough drop, do not make noise with the wrapper.
- ◆ DO laugh when the performance is funny
- ◆ DO applaud when it is appropriate during the performance.
- ◆ DO applaud when the performance is over...this tells the performers and crew that you appreciate their work.
- ◆ DO tell all your friends, after the show, what a great time you had.
